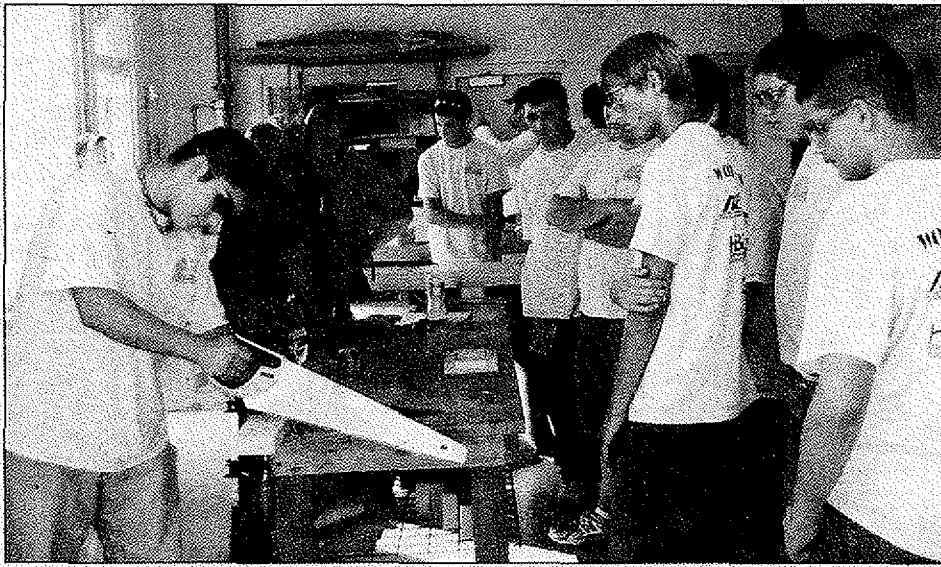
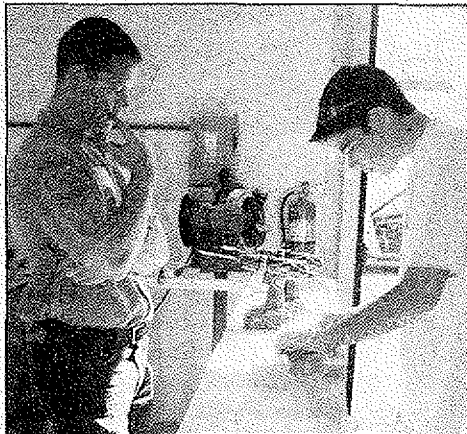


PHS hosts Construction Challenge
